WELCOME

LEADER TIP: Arriving early to pray over the room, playing worship live or on a bluetooth speaker, and greeting attendees as they enter, creates an environment that welcomes God's presence and people well.

SAY: Welcome to First Priority! It's great to see you here today! This year, we are learning about Who God is and who He says we are! Each week of First Priority will feature a piece of our HOPE strategy. The O in HOPE stands for OPPORTUNITY. This week is OPPORTUNITY week, where we look at taking the opportunities to overcome anything in the way of us knowing Who God is and who He says we are! Today, our OPPORTUNITY GOAL is for us to identify and overcome any obstacle in the way of us believing that God is our Heavenly Father and we are His children!

LEADER TIP: Feel free to add your own words to this prayer.

SAY: Let's pray together. "God, You are our Heavenly Father! We invite Your presence to be with us in this room right now as we worship You. We know that we are never alone because we have You! We love You! In Jesus' Name, amen." (Psalm 22:3; Hebrews 13:5)

WORSHIP (OPTIONAL)

SAY: The word "praise" means "to applaud, to show gratitude, to honor." It's important for us to take every **opportunity** to praise our Heavenly **Father**. Our praise shows that we honor Him and are grateful for His presence in our lives! Let's praise God together!

SAY: Today's verse is Romans 8:14 which says, "For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the **children** of God."

LEADER TIP: One or more leaders may present the message. If you'd like to write the message in your own words, use the MESSAGE TIPS portion of the CLUB PLAN TEMPLATE provided at the end of this week's lesson.

SAY: To understand today's verse, we first need to know what it means to be a child of God. John chapter 1 verse 12 says, "But to all who believed in Him (Jesus) and accepted Him, He gave the right to become children of God." To be a child of God, we have to believe and accept Jesus as our Lord. Romans chapter 10 verse 9 tells us, "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." When we make the decision to choose Jesus as the "Lord" of our lives, we surrender everything to Him. Our thoughts, plans, dreams, and desires become His. If Jesus is our Lord, then His Holy Spirit lives in us. (Romans 8:9-11) When His Spirit lives in us, we can be led by Him as God's son or daughter!

What does it mean to be led by the Spirit of God, the Holy Spirit? When we are led by the Holy Spirit, our lives will produce the fruit of the Spirit. The fruit of the Spirit are characteristics that show the Holy Spirit is the leader of our lives. Galatians 5:22-23 says, "But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." If we are children of God and our lives are led by the Holy Spirit, we will show these characteristics with our words, actions, and how we treat others. How can we show others that we are God's children? Our life, words, and actions will be the proof that we belong to God's family. (John 13:34-35)

On **opportunity** week, we focus on identifying and overcoming any obstacles that can get in the way of us believing Who God is and who He says we are! We are going to look at a few of the obstacles that get in the way of us believing that we can be God's **children**. Some lies that our enemy, the devil, wants us to believe is that God doesn't want us and that we aren't good enough to be His **children**. (John 10:10) We can identify and know that this is a lie because Ephesians chapter 1 verse 5 tells us, "God decided in advance to adopt us into His own family by bringing us to Himself through Jesus Christ. This is what He wanted to do, and it gave Him great pleasure." This verse tells us that God wanted us! We have a place in His family. Because of what Jesus did for us, we don't have to try to be good enough. He makes us good enough! (Ephesians 2:8-9) This is the truth according to God's Word! (John 19; 1 John 1:7-9)

MESSAGE (continued)

Another lie the enemy wants us to believe is that we are not worthy of being loved. Have you ever felt like no one loves you or notices you? Maybe it's hard to understand that God is a good **Father** because you've never known what it was like to have a good **father**. First John 3 verse 1 says, "See how very much our **Father** loves us, for He calls us His **children**, and that is what we are!" We can believe this truth from God's Word that says we are loved! God loved us so much that He calls us His **children**! He is our Heavenly **Father**, Who will never leave us! (Hebrews 13:5)

Now that we have identified these lies as obstacles, let's learn about how we can overcome them. Last month on Evangelize week, we talked about Revelation chapter 12 verse 11, which tells us that we overcome by the word of our testimony. Proverbs chapter 18 verse 21 tells us that our mouths have the power to speak life. So how can we overcome the obstacles that come against us? We can overcome any obstacle that gets in the way of us believing that we are God's **children** by speaking, knowing, and believing God's Word! His Word is our weapon to defeat the enemy! (Ephesians 6:13-17)

If you have questions about what it means to be a **child** of God, or you want to make the decision to ask Jesus to be your Lord, our Campus Coach or one of our student leaders would love to talk with you before you leave! We can be encouraged today that we are never alone in God's family!
